More classrooms are in use per class period than ever before, HS Math Teacher Neil Basu said, a result of the school's record high for enrollment. Basu said he estimates about 98% of classrooms are in use every block, resulting in courses expanding outward from their typical departments, all of which are allocated six classrooms each.

"To make the schedule work, each department ends up having one period where we're running a seventh class, or even an eighth class," Basu said. "We're using almost every classroom, almost every period."

Course scheduling took Basu and Assistant Principal Natalie Maisey the "whole summer," Basu said, which involved checking every student's individual schedule multiple times.
